Post Injection Instructions for Patients

- Immediately after the treatment, the most commonly reported side effects were temporary redness and swelling at the injection site. These effects typically resolve within two to three (2 to 3) days. Cold compresses may be used immediately after the treatment to reduce swelling. If the inconvenience continues beyond two to three (2 to 3) days or if other reactions occur, please contact your physician.
- 2. Avoid rubbing the treated area within six (6) hours of your treatment. After that, the area can be gently washed with soap and water.
- 3. Until the initial redness and swelling have resolved, avoid exposure of the treated area to intense heat (sunlamp or sunbathing).
- 4. If you have previously suffered from facial cold sores, there is a risk that the needle punctures could contribute to another recurrence. Speak to your physician about medications that may minimize a recurrence.
- Evidence shows that having a follow-up treatment before the product has fully dissipated will enhance the lasting effect. Please be sure to consult your physician about recommendations for follow-up treatments.
- For one (1) week prior to your next treatment with, avoid taking aspirin, nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory medications, St. John's Wort, and high doses of Vitamin E supplements. These agents may increase bruising and bleeding at the injection site.
